**November 3, 2024** Behavior Guided by Love 1 Corinthians 8:1-13

Paul changes topics to a dispute concerning food offered to an idol. He begins by addressing their so-called knowledge. Their knowledge leads to misguided behavior based on their freedom in Christ. Namely, they believe they can do anything they want, without worrying about the fallout related to their behavior. Grounding one's behavior in love prevents the abuse of that freedom and the negative impact on others.
