In John 12, Jesus attends a dinner in Bethany. Many people are present at the meal, including Lazarus, Martha, and Mary. It was a dinner to remember. The dinner is remembered not because of the food, the teaching, or even the presence of Lazarus, the man who was dead but is now alive, it is remembered because of what Mary did. Mary anoints Jesus. Her act is still remembered 2,000 years later.
