October 1, 2023 Behold the Man John 19:1-7

The trial of Jesus by Pilate continues. Unable to convince the crowd to free Jesus, Pilate employs a new strategy to gain Jesus' release. Pilate believes if he can publicly humiliate Jesus that would gain the crowd's sympathy, effecting Jesus' release. Pilate flogs Jesus and the soldiers place a crown of thorns on His head. Standing with Jesus before the crowd, Pilate proclaims, "Behold, the man."
